New educational trail in the heart of the Colibris Park woods

The Colibris Park woodland redevelopment project, winner of the municipality's very first participatory budget, is now accessible.

A 380-meter trail covered with mulch and featuring a gathering area with furniture has been created. Educational panels have also been installed to teach visitors about the area's flora and fauna.



The project was made possible thanks to a \$50,000 budget.

Undergrowth shrubs and various floral arrangements complete the landscaping to reflect the richness of the natural ecosystem.

The City of Cowansville warmly thanks all citizens who submitted a project or took part in the vote.

The next project submission period for the 2026-2027 participatory budget will be announced in the spring of 2026.

New pedestrian crossing in front of the hospital

In order to improve pedestrian safety and facilitate active transportation in this busy area, a new crosswalk has been installed on Main Street, in front of the Brome-Missisquoi-Perkins Hospital.

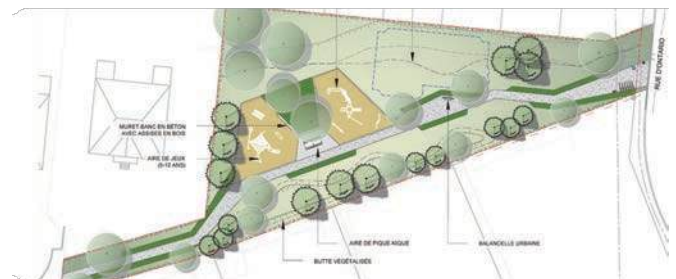
Equipped with solar-powered flashing lights and clearly visible signage, it ensures safe crossing at all times.

When approaching crosswalks, drivers must exercise extra caution and yield to pedestrians.



Did you know that the Highway Safety Code also applies to pedestrians?

Pedestrians have the right of way over drivers and cyclists. Drivers and cyclists must stop to let pedestrians cross once they have stepped onto the yellow or white stripes or have clearly indicated their intention to do so.



The new park is located on Ontario Street, near Louis-Joseph-Papineau Boulevard

The park will include two playgrounds (one for children aged 2 to 5 and the other for children aged 5 to 12), street furniture, and trees and shrubs.

Project timeline:

2025: Grading of the land, earthworks, seeding, planting of trees and shrubs, preparation of bases for modules and furniture.

2026: installation of street furniture and play modules.
