



## The emerald ash borer: a strong opponent

The emerald ash borer, an insect from Asia, is currently wreaking havoc in southern Quebec and Cowansville is no exception. Once established in an area, it typically kills over 90% of ash trees over a period of 8 to 10 years. The insect attacks all species of ash (Fraxinus spp), which makes all trees of this type, without exception, vulnerable.

Currently, on the territory of the municipality, approximately twenty trees are affected by the emerald ash borer. The latter, which will have to be cut down this fall, will be replaced by native tree species, less susceptible to disease and insect pests.

Although preventative treatments exist, it is unfortunately envisioned that the region will lose most of its ash population.

#### Main signs that may indicate that a tree is infested with the emerald ash borer:

Loss of a large part of the foliage at the top

Implantation of other plants at the base of the tree

Larval galleries under the bark

"D" shaped exit holes

Woodpecker holes and bark removal by squirrels

#### I am the owner, what should I do?

The landowner is responsible for cutting down dead trees and disposing of them safely. Please note that a logging permit may be required and that the transport of infested ash wood is prohibited between April 1st and September 30th, under federal regulations.

## **Peddling**

#### Do peddlers come to your house?

You have the right to ask to see the permit granted by the City.

When in doubt, do not allow anyone to enter your home.

Anyone who contravenes Regulation 1696 (RM 220) on peddling commits an offense and is liable to a fine.

The peddler is under the obligation:

- of having a valid permit from the Office de la protection du consommateur:
- of obtaining a permit from the City of Cowansville authorizing door-to-door sollicitation:
- to be able to present the permits to you;
- to respect the authorized hours, from Monday to Saturday between 10 a.m. and 6 p.m.

If the peddler does not have a permit issued by the City,

• contact the Sûreté du Québec at 450 266-1122.



# Labor shortage: THE challenge for businesses

The City of Cowansville began a process in June with manufacturing companies located in its territory in order to target the main challenges related to the recruitment of labor. Two meetings took place until now.

Among the possible solutions: attracting and retaining experienced workers. According to an article published by the Quebec Employers Council (CPQ), the employment rate of 60-69 year olds in Quebec remains lower than in the rest of Canada.

Also according to the CPQ, certain measures should be added, including an increase in the tax credit for career extension and the revision of the QPP contribution rules for workers aged 60 and over.

The City is currently surveying its retired citizens in order to paint a picture of the local situation and to learn more about the obstacles related to returning to work for some of them. The survey is available at: cowansville.ca.

Other actions are to be expected, including the creation of a committee bringing together different industries in order to continue the actions initiated so far and to propose new ones. (training, workshop, pilot project).

## Car-sharing service for citizens and organizations



You can book a car from the municipality through a car-sharing system. This is a 100% electric car (Mitsubishi i-MiEV) available upon reservation. The rental cost can range from \$21 to \$31 per day, depending on the length of the rental. A vehicle disinfection protocol is also in place. The car-sharing project will be tested for a six-month period (April 2021-October 2021).

# Expansion of the Jacques-Bonnette natural park

The City of Cowansville recently acquired 74,947.2 square meters (7.49 hectares) of land for the purpose of conservation and enhancement of the natural environments in the Jacques-Bonnette Natural Park sector.

Although the layout of this new space remains to be determined, it is certain that this space will be added to the green spaces already accessible to citizens.

The purchase of this land, which represents an investment of \$236,000, will also allow the municipality to acquire the adjacent land (land given to the City in park fees following the development of rue Jules-Monast). It is therefore two sites, totaling more than 105,000 square meters (10.5 hectares), which will enhance this natural public space.

Remember that the Jacques-Bonnette Natural Park was created in 2010. It is a popular place for nature and ornithology enthusiasts. The park, located in the heart of the city, already totaled an area of 18.6 hectares.




#### Actions to counter Eurasian watermilfoil

The City of Cowansville and the Lake Davignon Watershed Conservation Committee are joining forces in the fight against Eurasian Watermilfoil, an invasive aquatic plant found in Lake Davignon and in many lakes and streams in southern Quebec. The priority: avoid its proliferation.

In this sense, the City has obtained confirmation from the Minister of Forests, Wildlife and Parks, Mr. Pierre Dufour, that it will have access to a \$15,000 grant from the provincial government for the construction of a cleaning station for mobile boats at Lake Davignon. This cleaning station, which will be installed at the Centre de la nature, will allow boaters to wash their boat before and after each outing to prevent the spread of Eurasian watermilfoil or other invasive species. (e.g. thorny water louse, zebra mussel, water chestnut).

In order to respect the criteria for the grant, the construction will take place no later than March 1, 2022, the deadline for carrying out the project.



#### Other actions

Thanks to the cooperation of the Lake Davignon

Watershed Conservation Committee, other actions have been put in place.

Awareness posters were installed at the Désourdy landing and the Centre de la Nature and six buoys were installed on the lake to help users identify and avoid problem areas.

Remember that Eurasian Watermilfoil is not a poisonous plant. However, seagrass beds can quickly grow in size and prevent the use of these areas for recreational activities (swimming, boat traffic). This plant also contributes to the eutrophication of the lake and to the reduction of its biodiversity.



LITTLE REMINDER To preserve the health of riparian strips and Lake Davignon, make sure to use the landing stages provided for this purpose the next time you go out on the lake.






