I want to reassure citizens that we will take this new reality into account in the 2024 budgetary planning. We are actively working to diminish the negative effects for citizens to maintain balance between our town's economic growth and protecting the purchasing power of our citizens.

In the coming weeks, we will also work on updating our family and senior's policy. Your active participation in this process will be very important because it will allow us to target the needs of our community. We will keep you posted about this and the consultations to come.

In conclusion, I invite you to participate in the "Fêtes des Dollars Cowansville" campaign. It is a nice way to thank citizens who buy local and encourage various municipal businesses.



On September 12, a new three-year valuation roll was submitted by LBP Évaluateurs agrées. The evaluations written in this roll will be in effect for 2024-2025-2026. These take into account the building's state, certain physical characteristics and market conditions as of July 1, 2022.

Given the growth in the property market since the last three-year valuation roll, property values have for the most part significantly increased. The average value of the rise in the property roll is situated at 50.43% for all categories.

In January 2024, an evaluation notice will be sent out with your new municipal tax account. Your tax account will be calculated according to this new roll based on the tax rate that will be adopted by the municipal council on December 18, 2023.

Of course, the municipal council will remain sensitive to this record increase. Different scenarios are being studied to minimize its impact on citizens and ensure the quality of municipal services.

SNOW REMOVAL

Bin Collection

Place your bins on the curb the night before collection and quickly remove them to allow snow removal personnel to adequately clean the streets.

Private Entrance Snow Removal

When removing snow from your private entrance, put the snow on your yard and not on that of the municipality as to not infringe upon snow removal operations.



Garage shelters and snow stakes

Make sure you install your garage shelter and snow stakes on your property. Structures and markers in the right-of way hinder snow removal operations and slow down workers.

Safety first and foremost

During snow removal operations, be courteous by yielding to snow removal vehicles so they can perform their duties safely. We also invite you to stay safe on the roads.

At all times, it is recommended that vehicles be parked in private driveways to facilitate snow removal in the streets.

ANIMAL PERMIT

In Cowansville, all dog or cat owners are obligated to obtain an animal permit for each animal and to make sure that their furry companion wears the tag given by the Town.



ANIMAL REGISTRY

Before being able to obtain an animal permit and a tag you must register yourself as well as your cat(s) or dog(s) on Cowansville's Pet registry.





WHY MICROCHIPPING?

The advantages of microchipping are numerous however, it will allow better, more efficient, and structured animal management on the municpal territory. It will also diminish the number of unnecessary or inappropriate euthanasias. The quality of the animal service will be more enhanced and management of dangerous dogs will be easier.

Davignon Lake-Follow-up consultations on the restriction of motor watercrafts on the lake

Following the information and citizen consultation session held last May 31 and June 15, the Town of Cowansville is currently working and will be for the next few months to prepare an action plan to continue the analysis of the needs and impact of the motor watercraft regulation project on Davignon Lake.

Varying comments, suggestions and regulatory and non regulatory measures have been shared by participants during the meetings and by modes of communication put at the citizens' disposal.

As mentionned, during the information sessions and the public consultations, the project is under evaluation and various knowledge aquistition actions as well as sensitization will have to be done before going any further in the analysis of the regulation procedures.

The Town wishes to thank its citizens for their involvement and sharing of comments. These will be integrated into the action plan.

More details concerning the analysis of the watercraft regulation project will be broadcast in Spring 2024.

- 1. If you bought your Christmas tree live in a pot, keep and maintain it indoors until the spring. You can then transplant it outdoors when there will be no more frost on the ground.
- 2. If your tree was cut, place it in your yard making sure it is well secured and stable. It will be a refuge for birds and small animals during the winter.
- **3.** You can cut it to make firewood for an outdoor camp fires (in a regulatory fireplace).
- 4. If you or your neighbor have a wood chipper, you can transform for Christmas tree into wood chips which could be spread on your yard or integrated in compost.
- **5.** The needles can be used to make cedar scented potpourri.





When Carbon monoxide shows up

With the cold season approaching, if you have a wood burning, granular, propane, natural gas, oil heating device or have an attached garage (with or without a car in it) you are at risk of getting the formation of carbon monoxide in the house.

Carbon monoxide or Co, is odorless and invisible.

The only way to detect it is through the installation of a carbon monoxide detector. This device should be installed at least 5 meters from the bedroom doors.

We remind you that according to Cowansville's fire safety rules and regulations a carbon monoxide detector is mandatory for all homes in the above situations.

What to do if the carbon monoxide detector alarm rings?

- Do not take a Co alarm lightly.
 That is the reason why we have this device.
 It detects what we cannot detect ourselves.
- 2. Gather everyone present in the home and evacuate.
- 3. Dial 9-1-1 to get firefighter help.
- **4**. Stay close to the house to transmit any information firefighters.
- 5. Never go back into the house until you have received permission from the firefighters.




