## Upcoming city council meetings

Council meetings take place at City Hall and are broadcast live on the City's website.



Cowansville is now one of the 84 cities in Quebec where a Generations Chair is located. This chair was created and donated by the students of Curé-A.-Petit school and the Mères au front group. This chair will represent future generations in the municipal council and town hall, aiming to put the environment at the heart of decision-making.









## Accountability and upcoming projects

The City of Cowansville is presenting the first assessment of its 2023-2030 strategic planning adopted last April. This 2023 accountability report provides an overview of the interventions carried out.

# Focus Area 1: A city that puts the environment at the heart of its concerns

- Adoption of a new Environmental Policy outlining the municipality's vision and objectives.
- Adoption of a municipal bylaw on the use of pesticides.
- Extensive consultation on Lake Davignon and authorized uses on the water body.
- Maintenance of the municipal Blue Fund to ensure funding for actions to preserve Lake Davignon.

# Focus Area 2: A dynamic living environment centered on the needs of its population

- Refurbishment of the skatepark at the Centre de la Nature.
- Construction of a new rental pavilion at the Centre de la Nature.
- Construction of the new municipal garage and upgrading of the wastewater treatment plant to meet the needs and population growth.
- New Colibris School: collaboration through land allocation and sector security.

# Focus Area 3: A municipality economically sustainable, enriched by its business community

- Call for projects for the establishment of a hotel in Cowansville and announcement of a future project (2024).
- Inauguration of Zeal Motor's facilities in the Southwest Industrial Park.
- An industrial incubator at full capacity.

## Focus Area 4: Sound management of growth

- Significant citizen consultation on the future of South Street.
- Installation of parking meters for access to Centre de la Nature parking for non-resident visitors and to reserve access to the dock for citizens only.

## Upcoming in 2024

- Installation of a self-service windshield washer station.
- Launch of the tender for plans and specifications for the upgrade of the Aquatic Centre.
- Continued actions to counter Eurasian watermilfoil in Lake
  Davignon, in collaboration with the Lake Davignon Watershed
  Protection Committee.
- Refurbishment of the Sports Pavilion with LED lighting, replacement of central seats, and installation of 4 electric charging stations.
- Development of pickleball courts (conditional on obtaining a grant).
- Adoption of a policy on affordable housing and update of the Family and Seniors Policy.

On April 8th at 3:27 PM, for an approximate duration of 3 minutes, there will be a total solar eclipse. This fascinating astronomical phenomenon occurs rarely, and it may be the only time you'll have the chance to observe a total eclipse!

## Nature Center 2:00 PM to 4:00 PM

- Watch a live broadcast from the ASTROLab at Mont-Mégantic National Park to understand the solar eclipse.
- Observation of the phenomenon through special glasses designed for observing the eclipse.

It is important to note that looking directly at the Sun, even when partially obscured during an eclipse, can damage your eyes without proper protection. It is essential to use solar eclipse glasses or appropriate protective devices to observe this phenomenon safely. Glasses are available for citizens at City Hall, the Aquatic Centre, and the municipal library.

## Lake Davignon - Follow-up on public consultations

Following the citizen information and consultation sessions held on May 31st and June 15th, 2023, regarding the regulation project for motorized watercraft on Lake Davignon, the City of Cowansville is currently working on developing an action plan to maintain the health of Lake Davignon. Various comments, suggestions, and ideas for regulatory and non-regulatory measures were made by participants.

The City of Cowansville would like to thank the citizens for their involvement and the comments received. Many of these will be integrated into the action plan.

The project is currently being evaluated, and various actions will need to be carried out before proceeding further with the analysis of the motorized watercraft regulation process.

## Eurasian watermilfoil

This summer, the City will continue the Eurasian watermilfoil control operations at Lake Davignon in collaboration with RAPPEL experts and the Lake Davignon Watershed Protection Committee. Just like in 2023, burlap sheets will be laid at the bottom of the lake to limit the growth and proliferation of this invasive exotic aquatic plant.

## Rain garden

Since 2022, the City has been pleased to offer a grant program to citizens who wish to create a rain garden at their home. Take advantage of the assistance provided by the OBV Yamaska during planning, the substrate provided free of charge by the City, a 50% reimbursement of the costs of work and plant purchases, up to a maximum amount of \$1000 per address.

## IMPORTANT: Toilets are not trash cans

Single-use wipes: a real scourge for the municipal sewage system. Although they are convenient for all family members, they should be disposed of in the trash and not flushed down the toilet.

Wipes form plugs that clog the pipes of the sewer system and the pumps of pumping stations. These items are household waste that do not disintegrate on their own.



## Dandelion Challenge - When to mow the lawn?

The objective of this challenge is to delay mowing the dandelions to offer their pollen and nectar to pollinating insects. To do this, the municipality will postpone the first lawn mowing on several municipal grounds. Small signs will be installed to inform citizens. Citizens are also encouraged to delay mowing their lawn.

With the Dandelion Challenge, the goal is not to stretch mowing throughout the month of May, but rather to let the dandelions bloom before mowing them.




